

A parallel narrative tells Angus Seaton's story: He was seventeen years old when he worked on the *Mackay-Bennett*, the first ship responsible for recovering bodies and personal effects after the *Titanic* sank.

With an eye for detail, Julie Lawson has woven a fascinating story around historical fact. Loaded with lesser-known *Titanic* trivia, this post-disaster approach is fresh and original, and includes just the right amount of grisly details to intrigue young readers.

Julie Lawson spent eighteen years as an elementary school teacher before becoming a full-time author. She has written nearly two dozen books for young people, published in her native Canada, where this story takes place.
