

Look and Be Grateful Tomie dePaola

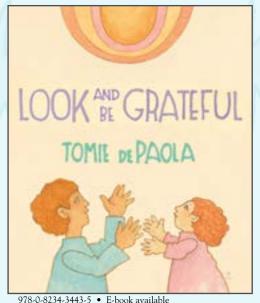
Guided Reading Level: I Grade Level Equivalent: 1 Interest Level: Pre-K-5



In this meditative picture book that encourages each one of us to be thankful, a young boy admires all that surrounds him and realizes, "Today is today, and it is a gift."

Educational Description: reading literature; inspirational prose, illustrations enhance meaning and tone, comprehension strategies; main idea/central message, point of view, author's purpose, language skills; new vocabulary, nuances in word meaning

- What does it mean to be "grateful"? Create a synonym chart (show appreciation, being thankful, returning kindness) RL.K-3.4, L.K-3.5
- How are "grateful" and "gratitude" related? L.K-3.5
- Discuss: How are you grateful? How do you show gratitude? SL.K-3.4
- Read Look and Be Grateful. RL.K-3.10
- What is the main idea or central message of Look and Be Grateful? RL.3.2
- CCSS What sense is described through words and illustrations? (sight) RL.K-1.4
- What information did you get from the illustrations that you did not get from the words in the story? RL.K-3.7
- Find words and phrases that appeal to the senses from the story. RL.K-3.4
- What does the author mean by "gift" in the story? Compare and contrast gifts that can and cannot be wrapped. L.K-4.4, 4a
- Draw and share a picture of a gift that you received that cannot be wrapped or put into a box. Hang on a class *Look and Be Grateful* bulletin board. SL.K-3.5
- Why do you think Tomie dePaola wrote the book? What kind of person do you think he is? RL.K-3.1
- What did you personally learn from reading/listening to the story? Write a sentence and draw a picture. Educators: You may also reproduce the attached and distribute to students. W.K.3.8
- Create a daily journal about things that you are grateful for. Use all your senses: touch, hearing, sight, taste and smell. W.K-3.3, 8
