

Learning Objectives

Students will read new text; use illustrations and details in a story to describe its characters, setting, or events; recognize and produce rhyming words; learn about letters, sounds, and words; and apply skills and extend comprehension through discussion, instruction, and writing.

BEFORE READING

- Discuss the front cover illustrations and the book title. Have you seen or used a pogo stick? It helps you bounce or hop up and down.
- In this story, the boy hops around town. He sees many things. He buys some things, too. Let's see why he is buying food.
- Take a picture walk. Discuss what is happening in the story. Emphasize the use of illustrations to help describe the characters, setting, and events.

DURING READING

As students read softly, notice what individuals do and support when necessary.

• When a student struggles to read a word promote the use of more than one strategy: Will the picture help you? Does it sound right and make sense? What sounds do those letters make? Did you see this word on the previous page?

AFTER READING

Have students share their responses to the story. Encourage them to listen and respond to each other's thinking. Use some of these questions during the discussion. Encourage students to refer back to the text and illustrations to support their thinking.

QUESTIONS

- Where does the story take place? Or, what is the setting?
- Who is the main character in the story?
- What happened at the beginning of the story?
- Where does the boy go? What does he do?
- How does the story end?
- How does the boy feel about his adventures? How do you know?

Here are literature and writing activities with reproducibles to share with your students.

WORD WORK

- Find the words that are repeated. (I, hop, see, we)
- Let's look for the word ______. (we, I, hop, look, see, fall, apples, cheese, pay, bread, Grandma) Use what you know about letter sounds and the information from pictures to help.
- Make words that rhyme with *hop*. Read your words to your partner. (Use attached reproducible, All About Words!)

WRITING & ART

The boy in this story saw a lot of things and people while he was hopping around the neighborhood. Let's write a new sentence that tells about something you can see when you go around town. (Use attached reproducible, Time to Draw!)

- Listen and write down the sounds that you hear.
- Now add your own word to finish the sentence, I see_____. Choose a word that was not in the book.
- Draw a picture to match your words.
- Did you remember to start your sentence with a capital letter and end your sentence with a period?


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

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
