

ABOUT THE BOOK

This companion book to the authors' Robert F. Sibert Award-winning *Honeybee* explores the life and habitat of a majestic endangered species through dramatic text and sumptuous illustration.

As spring approaches in the Arctic, a mother polar bear and her two cubs tentatively emerge from hibernation to explore the changing landscape. When it is time, she takes her cubs on a forty-mile journey, back to their home on the ice. Along the way, she fends off wolves, hunts for food, and swims miles and miles.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Setting is when and where a book takes place. Where is *Polar Bear* set? The opening page states that it is the month of April. Take clues from the text and the illustration and describe April in the Arctic.
- What happens in the polar bear's den in the winter? In what ways does the mother prepare her cubs for life outside the den? Look at the third illustration where the mother polar bear is standing. Why is she looking off in the distance? How does she get her cubs used to the cold outdoors?



- Describe the journey the mother polar bear and her cubs take to their home by the sea. Explain how the mother polar bear senses danger. Study the illustration of the wolf attack. How does the illustrator make the animals look fierce and angry?
- Explain how the cubs learn to hunt for food from their mother. Describe what happens when the ice melts and the mother cannot find food. How does she encourage her cubs to safety?
- Trace the life of the bears throughout the remainder of the year. Which months are the toughest to survive? At what point do the cubs separate from their mother?

- What is the book's message about climate change? How does climate change affect animals like the polar bears?
- List all the cool facts about polar bears presented in the text. Compare these cool facts to other facts found in the back of the book.
